Update to Medical Requirements

The Bailiwick of Guernsey and Bailiwick of Jersey Civil Aviation Administration have no operational objection to flights of UK registered aircraft being conducted to, from and within the Channel Islands by holders of UK issued flight crew and pilot licences and who have made UK CAA Pilot Medical Declarations, subject to such flights being conducted in accordance with the privileges and any other conditions imposed by the UK CAA.

Medical requirements for private pilots - LAPL | Civil Aviation Authority (caa.co.uk) provides further information on medical standards, certificates and self-declaration of medical fitness.

UK AIP and chart format changes – AIRAC 07/2022

To comply with regulatory requirements changes will be made to the format of the UK AIP and Aeronautical Charts effective AIRAC 07/2022:

- ENR 3 ATS Routes: Tables restructured.
- ENR 5.5 Aerial Sporting/Recreational Activities: For easy reference all sites published in a single alphabetical list regardless of type.
- AD 2 Aerodromes: New section "AD 2.25 Visual segment surface penetration".
- SID/STAR/IAC: Changes to accommodate conventional navaids on PBN procedures.
- SID/STAR/& Coding tables: FLs be shown as FL+three digits to include a leading zero where applicable e.g. FL050.
- For consistency "SFC" will be used throughout the AIP as an upper limit reference.

The Aviation Safety (Amendment) Regulations 2022

The Aviation Safety (Amendment) Regulations 2022 (SI 2022 No. 637) was laid in parliament on 10 June 2022 which amends:

UK Regulation (EU) 2018/1976 (Sailplanes) UK Regulation (EU) 2018/395 (Balloons) UK Regulation (EU) No. 1178/2011 (Aircrew), and UK Regulation (EU) 2019/947 (Unmanned Aircraft) on 1 July 2022 and UK Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 (Basic Regulation) on 1 July 2022 and 1 January 2023

See The Aviation Safety (Amendment) Regulation 2022 (SI 2022 No. 637) and its Explanatory Memorandum.

Consolidated versions of the amended Regulations will be published on the CAA website as soon as they are available.

Clear Prop!

Another successful flight with the recently installed Woodcomp 3 blade propellor.

The decision was made to install the new prop at the same time as completing the Rotax 912 600 hour gearbox service. After submitting new weight and balance calculations and subsequent paperwork including test flight results the prop was finally approved.

The engine is much smoother, short field take off improved and impressive climb rate, which is very handy for short fields like Clipgate. There may be some further tweaking in the future to improve performance all subject to Engineering approval of course.

Today the AAIB published two very sad reports that highlight the issue of partial power loss. We've all trained for loss of power, usually total loss of power by closing the throttle to simulate, but having spoken to my flying colleagues none have practiced a partial engine power loss.

I recall back a few years, this was a topic GASCO were talking about as the Australian Transportation Board had published an article on the matter which you can read by clicking here.

The two reports from the AAIB were G-CJZU and G-BBSA for those who might want to read them.

This topic really got me thinking as I'd experienced partial power loss myself I found it really easy to think the engine would just continue and make the destination but I also found myself distracted diagnosing the issue rather than the primary task of flying the aircraft. There are some interesting recommendations in the AAIB reports – I do wonder why we don't practice this scenario with an instructor onboard.

Maybe something to consider with an instructor on your next biennial?


Defunct Kent Airfields


